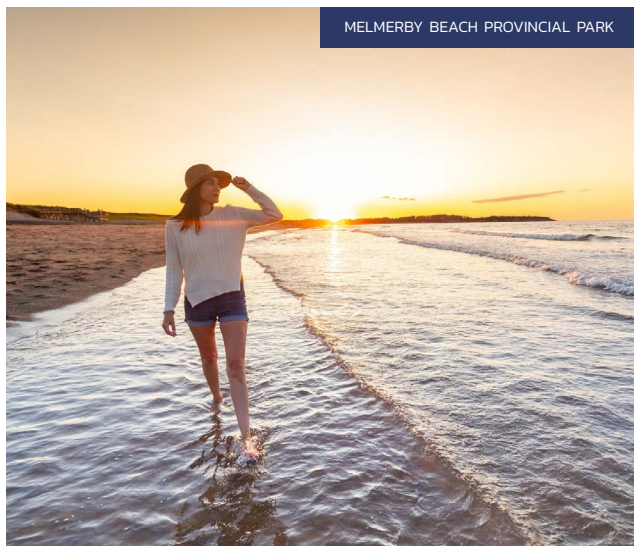
GET COZY UNDER THE STARS.
